Consider the STARS Study for People with Epilepsy Aged 12+



A clinical study for people with epilepsy who experience prolonged seizures

We understand how difficult it is living with epilepsy and worrying about seizures, especially for people who experience prolonged seizures.



The STARS Study evaluates if an inhaler containing an investigational drug is able to quickly stop prolonged seizures (i.e. lasting more than 3 minutes) once they have begun.

During this initial study the inhaler will be used to treat one seizure during the 12-week period, and participants will also be able to use rescue medications should their seizure persist after using the inhaler.



Two versions of the inhaler will be tested in this initial study and there is a 50% chance of receiving each inhaler:


- One version will contain the active investigational drug
- One version will contain a placebo (looks identical, but contains no active medication)

The STARS Study will last up to approximately 19 weeks and includes a 6-week Screening Period, a 12-week Study Treatment Period, and a Follow-up Visit 5-12 days after the study treatment period ends.

Participants may have the option of joining an extension study after completing this initial study, where all participants will receive the inhaler with the active investigational drug - there will be no placebo.







Participants will have their health closely monitored throughout the study, while helping advance research.
